Waterford invites public to experience Folk Art from Australia

BISMARCK, N.D. — The public is invited to attend a special Folk Art performance by Martin and Aubrey Beggs — brothers from Australia — on Tuesday, Mar. 11 at 2:30 p.m. There is no admission charge for the performance, which will be held at Waterford on West Century, 1000 West Century Ave., in Bismarck.

The Beggs brothers will provide an “Australian kaleidoscope” of music, dance and history. The two live in Long Jetty, New South Wales, and are visiting the area as part of the artist-in-residence program sponsored by the North Dakota Council on the Arts and the Bismarck Public Schools. The brothers say their presentation weaves together tales from “the only continent that is also a country” and highlights settlers, including miners, farmers, shearers and explorers, as well as the Aboriginal people, who have lived there for approximately 40,000 years.
